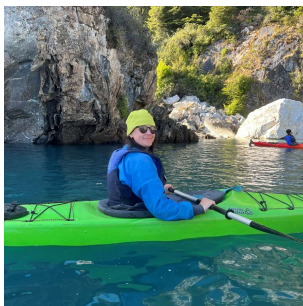
Liam Hasty, Educator (he/him)
